

# SO YOU WANT TO NEUTER YOUR DOG?

Dogs should be *at least 6 months of age* before we consider them a good candidate for surgery.

Have a large breed dog? Talk to one of our doctors about why we might want to wait a little longer to neuter.

## #1 WHEN SHOULD I NEUTER?

### HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

Canine Neuter*	< 2 yrs. old	2 yrs. & older
< 20 lbs.	\$ 235	\$ 378
20 - 39 lbs.	\$ 237	\$ 380
40 - 79 lbs.	\$ 279	\$ 422
80 - 120 lbs.	\$ 339	\$ 482
> 120 lbs.	\$ 403	\$ 546

\* Additional charges may apply for dogs over 160# or cryptorchid cases

What does this include? The base price includes a pre-surgical exam, general anesthesia, the surgical procedure, and appropriate pain medications to go home.

PREANESTHETIC BLOODWORK

Ensures that all vital organ systems are healthy enough to undergo anesthesia!

CATHETER AND IV FLUIDS

Provides intravenous access in case of emergency and allows us to provide IV fluids to keep your dog hydrated throughout surgery.\*

LASER PACKAGE

CO2 laser that allows for less bleeding, and faster healing times as well as post-operative therapeutic laser to decrease inflammation.\*

MICROCHIP

Includes implantation and registration in the case that your pet gets lost!

## Preparing for the Big Day

### Before the procedure

- DO plan on dropping on between 7:45-8:30 am the morning of the procedure
- DO allow 10-15 minutes for a technician to review the consent form
- DO NOT feed anything after 10 pm the night before the procedure
- DO NOT withhold water overnight



### After the procedure

- DO plan on picking up the day of the procedure between 4:30-6 pm
- DO allow 10-15 minutes for a technician to review the discharge instructions
- DO NOT allow any running, jumping or playing while the incision is healing (10-14 days)
- DO NOT allow your pup to lick at their incision!



## SCHEDULING CONFLICT?

Don't worry about it!

Ask us about dropping off the night before or picking up the morning after surgery.

**IMPORTANT POINT!**  
If you think your pet might need sedatives or an e-collar, let us know!
